

Madera Community College LVN to RN Associate in Science Degree of Nursing (ADN) Program

Policy and Procedure: Military Personnel – Challenge / Advanced Placement into the Registered Nursing Program

Individuals with prior Military Health Care experience—such as Navy Hospital Corpsman, Air Force Medical Technician, Army 68-series Specialist, or Air Force Independent Duty Medical Technician—may apply for the LVN to RN Associate in Science Degree Program at Madera Community College. Applicants must hold a current, unencumbered California LVN license, obtained either through BVNPT Method 4 (military challenge) or an accredited LVN program.

Procedure:

1. Counseling Appointment:

Interested applicants must schedule an appointment with a counselor *prior* to the application period to review eligibility for the LVN to RN program.

2. Eligibility Criteria for Military Personnel and Veterans:

Applicants must provide:

- DD214 showing an honorable discharge or current active-duty honorable service (documented by a letter from a supervisor).
- Military transcripts (e.g., JST/SMART).
- o Relevant military training completed within the last five years.

3. Qualified Military Roles Include (but are not limited to):

- Navy Hospital Corpsman
- o Air Force Medical Technician
- Army 68-series Combat Medic Specialist
- o Air Force Independent Duty Medical Technician

4. Required Documentation:

- Official transcripts from military and/or academic programs showing satisfactory coursework and clinical experience.
- Documentation of hands-on healthcare experience.

5. Program Requirements:

- Fulfillment of all general LVN to RN program admission requirements as outlined in the Madera Community College Catalog.
- Completion of all BRN-mandated prerequisite courses.
- A minimum score of 62% on the ATI TEAS exam.



6. Admission Process:

 Admission is space-available and competitive. Qualified applicants may be placed on an alternate list if necessary.

7. Challenge/Placement into RN 160 Course:

Selected applicants may challenge the RN 160 LVN to RN Transitions course.

Requirements include:

- Minimum 75% on four written challenge exams.
- o 90% or higher on a medication math proficiency exam (maximum two attempts).
- Achievement of satisfactory performance through evaluations aligned with course objectives.

8. Clinical Skills Competency

Applicants must demonstrate proficiency in essential nursing skills required after RN-160, including, but not limited to:

- Head to toe physical assessment, cardiovascular assessment and neuro-geriatric focused assessment
- Urinary catheter insertion and care
- Tracheostomy care and suctioning
- o Nasogastric tube insertion and management.
- o Intravenous IV Insertion
- IV Piggy back Medication Admin
- Safe medication administration practices
- Wound care and sterile dressing changes
- Patient safety and infection control techniques.

Satisfactory performance must be demonstrated through skills evaluations and check-offs that align with the course objectives of RN-160, the entry-level course for the RN program.

9. Prerequisite Completion:

All ADN prerequisite courses must be completed prior to program admission.
